Briathra - Verbs

In Irish, you use the simplest form of the verb when giving orders or instructions to another person. Here are some of the most common Irish verbs and how they are used in this way.

§1. Verbs to express motion

§6. Using the Imperative Mood

Use the *imperative mood* to give orders, requests or instructions.

To give instructions to one person, use the simplest form or *stem* of the verb without any suffixes. (Most dictionaries list verbs in this form.)

Some instructions can be used ordinarily in polite speech:

Come in! **Tar isteach!** *Sit down!* **Suigh síos!** *Look out!* **Coimhéd!**

Giving instructions can sound a little rude when talking to people you do not know well. So, remember to add a few polite phrases...

§7. The Imperative Mood - 2nd person plural

To give instructions to more than one person, add /əg'i:/ to the root of the verb.

Wait a minute, ladies and gentlemen! **Fanaigí nóméad, a dhaoine uaisle!**

Quiet (listen), children! **Éistigí, a pháistí!**

The First Conjugation

Irish verbs are divided into two types or *conjugations*, based on the endings that can be attached to the stem of the verb.

§8. Short-stem verbs

Type 1 or *short-stem* verbs have stems with only one syllable.

§9. Mutable verbs

There are a small number of verbs with stems that:

- Consist (usually) of two syllables
- Have a long vowel in the second syllable, followed by a (slender) consonant or consonant group
- Take the same endings as *Type 1 (short-stem)* verbs
- Broaden the final slender consonant of the stem before adding a suffix

The second *conjugation*, (Type 2) consists of verbs with stems of two or more syllables.

§10. Long-stem verbs

Second conjugation (Type 2) or *long-stem* verbs have stems that:

- Consist of two (or more) syllables
- End in **-(a)igh** /i:/

§11. Syncopated verbs

Syncopated verbs have stems that:

- End in /əl' /, /ər' /, /ən' / or /əs' /
- Take the same endings as *Type 2 (long-stem)* verbs
- Lose the unaccented vowel sound when adding other syllables (and change the final consonant from slender to broad if the preceding consonant is broad)

§12. Non-syncopated verbs

There are a small number of verbs with stems that belong to the second declension, but do not lose their unstressed vowel in the second syllable. If the stem ends in a slender **l**, it changes to a broad **l** before adding a suffix.

§13. Irregular verbs

Here are the 11 irregular Irish verbs. These verbs do not always behave according to the patterns of other (regular) verbs.

As you can see in the table below, a couple of irregular verbs use different stems in the plural form.

§14. Negative of the Imperative Mood

To tell someone *not* to do something:

- Put **ná** before the verb.
- **Ná** prefixes **h-** to verbs that start with a vowel.

Don't do that, Johnny! **Ná déan sin, a Sheáinín!**
/Nɑ: d'e:n s'in' ə hɑ:n'i:n'/

Don't do that, children! **Ná déanaigí sin, a leanaí!**
/Nɑ: d'e:nəg'i: s'in' ə l'æ:ni:/

Don't mention it! **Ná habair é!**
/Nɑ: ha:bər' e:'/

§15. Secondary forms of the Imperative Mood

Irish has a complete set of personal endings for the Imperative Mood. However, they are really only used in very formal speech.¹

For example, in the Irish Mass you often hear: **Guímis!** *Let us pray!*
